Dublin City Community Facilities Scheme

In March 2017, the Minister of State for Communities and the National Drugs Strategy Catherine Byrne TD announced a new €2m capital grants scheme. The scheme is focused on providing small-scale capital grants to grass roots community groups or organisations. The Minister has allocated €64,500 under the scheme to Dublin City.

The scheme in Dublin City is being administered by the Dublin City Local Community Development Committee (LCDC) and Dublin City Council. In line with the high level goals of the Dublin City Local Economic and Community Plan 2016 – 2021and the feedback from community consultations carried out in 2016, the Dublin City LCDC is now inviting applications for funding under the Dublin City Community Facilities Scheme 2017.

Applications are invited from groups or organisations to carry out **capital projects** or work that will promote participation and engagement in local communities or among a particular group or groups of people.

Applications for the Dublin City Community Facilities Scheme 2017 must clearly demonstrate how the funding will be used for capital projects or work or facilities that will promote participation and engagement among local communities or a particular group or groups of people.

Migrant Access Programme

New Communities Partnership, in collaboration with Mendicity Institution, has the great pleasure to announce a new and exciting nationwide FREE support service: Migrant Access Programme (MAP), created to empower and assist migrants in overcoming cultural and personal barriers to access employment. This project is funded by the European Social Fund Programme for Employability, Inclusion and Learning (PEIL) 2014-2020.

The aim is to support unemployed migrants to increase their employment opportunities in Ireland by assessing their skills and providing them with a

"Toolkit" that will benefit them in their career future.

The service is based on group sessions and one to one meetings of employment training, in which participants will have the opportunity to learn about writing a successful CV and Cover letter, finding career opportunities, presentation and effective communication skills, English for job seeking and basic IT skills. The training sessions will run in Dublin, Cork and Limerick on specific dates during the year.

Additionally, we will also offer Public Information Sessions for larger groups of people on employment Rights and entitlements, employment supports and services, qualification recognition, and volunteer and training experience in Ireland. Public Information Session will be delivered in Dublin, Cork, Limerick, Waterford, Tralee and Galway on specific dates.

This programme is part of NCP continuous work towards the empowerment and inclusion of ethnic minorities in Ireland.
