Street Feast is an Irish initiative to bring back life onto our streets. The idea is a simple one - to get as many people as possible across Ireland to sit down to a lunch with their neighbours in their local communities. It's a not-for-profit, all-for-fun,do-it-yourself celebration.

Street Feast is calling on people nationwide to come together at 12.00 noon to share food and conversation with neighbours as a simple and fun way of reconnecting and building social solidarity and resilience. It's a perfect excuse to share good food, meet your neighbours and have a bit of craic.

Street Feasts can be held anywhere; on the pavement, in a laneway or a local park. They can be any size, from 10 to 100 people. Everyone is invited to bring something to contribute, be it a tasty dish, some chairs or a musical instrument.

Last year we saw 197 Street Feasts take place in Dublin City, 1,215 took place all across Ireland with 120,000 people involved. We want 2017 to be the biggest, most inclusive and best one yet.
